




When it comes time to invite your counselor and recommenders, Common App will prompt you to complete the FERPA Release Authorization. FERPA (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act) is a law that protects the privacy of your education records. Completing the FERPA Release Authorization will grant your high school permission to send those records on your behalf.

COLLEGE TESTING POLICE

UNDERSTANDING EHESTESTING Always required: Standardized test scores

SECTION IN COMMON APP

The Testing section lets you self-report scores of any standardized tests you've taken. Standardized tests are any form of test that requires all test takers to answer the same questions in the same way, and that is scored in a "standard" or consistent manner.



Each college and university can chooseits own testing policy. If you're deciding which tests to take (or which to report), double-check the policies of the colleges you're applying to. College's testing requirements are listed on its College Information page. The Requirements Grid also shows you each college's and testing requirements.

Always required: Standardized test scor are always a required part of the application.

Sometimes required:Standardized test scores are sometimes required as part of the application. Check a college's College Information page for specific details.

Never required: Standardized test scores are never a required part of the application.

Flexible: This means alternatives to standardized test scores (like a graded paper) may be accepted. Colleges with this policy may also accept different types of tests, like AP tests. Be sure you check the college's website for more information.

<u>Ignored</u>:Standardized test scores are ignored if they are received

APPROACHING THE ACTIVITIES SECTI



- The Activities section is one of the seven sections of the Common App tab.
- In it you have the chance to tell colleges more about who you are outside the classroom
- You can use this section to highlight the activities that have been the most meaningful to you throughout high school

APPROACHING THE ACTIVITIES SECTI



- You can add up to ten activities to your application, but that doesn'tmean that you need to enter ten.
- On average, students applying through Common App report 6 activities.
- Don'tforget, this section is how collegescan get to know more about you. It can show what makes you unique your pursuits, interests, and passions
- Focus on what activities can best tell that story and not on the number you're reporting.

First, you'll select your activity type. If your activity type isn't listed, you can choose 'other club/activity" from the dropdown menu. You can give more details in the position/leadership and activity description fields.

Next, you'll briefly describe the activity and your position. You have limited space in these fields, so you may need to abbreviate words and simplify your grammar.

Example activity descriptions

Original

For two years I volunteered at my local animal shelter. I helped out where needed, but mainly walked dogs and monitored the front desk. Last year I was asked to take on more responsibility and have been volunteering as the receptionist during the weekends. (256 characters)

Edited

Volunteer at local animal shelter walking dogs and running front desk. Given more responsibility last year and now volunteer as receptionist. (141 characters)

HOW TO APPROACH THE ESSA



The Common App essay instructions ask you what you want the readers of your application to know about you apart from courses, grades, and test scores. You have 7 prompts but endless possibilities to tell your story.

Approx 500 words

Here are some ideas to inspire your thinking.




THE LESSONS WE TAKE FROM obstacles we encounter can be fundamental to later success. Recount a time when you faced a challenge, setback, or failure. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience?

THINK ABOUT

- All obstacles: big, small, personal, and societal
- Hardships faced by family or friends that also impacted you
- Unresolved challenges you're still struggling with

- How did I cope?
- How did I grow?
- Who helped me?




REFLECT ON A TIME WHEN you questioned or challenged a belief or idea. What prompted your thinking? What was the outcome?




SHARE AN ESSAY ON ANY topic of your choice. It can be one you've already written, one that responds to a different prompt, or one of your own design.

- Is there anything left unsaid in my application?

UNDERSTANDING RECOMMENDATION

Many colleges ask you to include letters of recommendation with your application. These letters are submitted recommenders. A recommender's input helps clarify and support the information you share in your application. They also help inform colleges about your academic potential and how you would fit in with their community



What to expect from the CSU admissions process

To apply to the CSU, you'll be required to:

- Omplete the Cal State Apply application
- 2 ay the \$70 per campus fee and any other fees (unless fee waiver applies)
- 3 ubmit any transcripts and required info when notified by the campus
- admitted, register for orientation
- ** Know when deadlines are and meet them**
- ** Check email regularly **





You'll need this information to apply

The CSU Educational Opportunity Program (EOP)

- Provides specialized support during your college years
- Designed to help *low-income*, *first generation*, *historically educationally disadvantaged* students succeed academically in college and graduate.
 - First Generation: neither of your parents went to college.
 - Meet the EOP Family Income Criteria
- The EOP application is built into the Cal State Apply application. You can submit the Cal State Apply application without the EOP portion complete and come back to it.

The EOP portion has a separate deadline that can vary by campus.

Materials you'll need to apply to EOP

Two Recommendations are required to apply

- 1) ne must be from academic counselor/teacher that can comment on your academic preparedness for university academic work. The other can be from an individual who can comment about your 2) otential to succeed in college.
- Recommenders cannot be self or a family member.
- You must include their names and email addresses on the application

Materials you'll need to apply to EOP

- Family Information including
 - Participation in public assistance programs and other publicly funded programs
 - Siblings educational information
 - Household size
- Parent/Guardian Information
 - Occupation information for at least one parent/guardian
 - Estimated and actual income for this and last year
 - Household size
- Prepare to answer some autobiographical questions



All freshman must provide this information for the 2023-24 application, not just if you're applying to EOP.

Standardized Tests (ACT, SAT, TOEFL, AP, IB, CLEP)

- For Fall 2023 freshman admissions, standardized tests will not be used to determine admissions eligibility.
- These scores may still be used to help place you in math and English courses by campuses
- You can enter your ACT, SAT, AP, IB, CLEP, TOEFL exams either have taken or plan on taking.
- If you have not taken or are not schedule to take any standardized tests you can opt out.




